White or Cream Emulsion Paint



PVA Glue + Water & a drop of Washing Up Liquid



Quick Drying Wall Filler



All Purpose Adhesive



Corrugated Cardboard



Piece of Ribbon or the Cord from a Shopping Bag



Tissue Napkins of your choice

How to make the Decorative Heart Plaque

Step 1: Preparing the Heart


- Print out the Heart Template provided in this Ebook or draw your own.
- Use this paper template to create a firmer template from cereal box card if you wish.
- Place the Heart template on the corrugated card and draw around it. You want to create 2 hearts, one with the card corrugation lines going horizontally and one with the lines going vertically. This gives added strength to your project.
- Using the All Purpose Adhesive glue the 2 heart pieces together.

Step 2: Strengthen the Plaque

- Using Quick Drying Wall Filler to cover the corrugated card holes around the edge.
 Smooth the filler into the holes at a 45° angel from both sides.
- if the paste feels a little dry, dip your finger in water and smooth over any lumps.
- Once the filler is dry, rub off any lumps that may be on the surface of the heart with kitchen paper towel.

Step 3: Preparing the Base

- Once the filler is dry paint the heart with the white or cream emulsion paint, including the sides.
- I recommend giving your heart 2 coats of the base colour so you don't have any patchy bits.
- Use a heat gun or hair dryer to speed up the drying process if you wish.









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Step 4: Prepare the Decoration

- Separate your 3-ply tissue napkins by gently taking off the top sheet with the images on.
- Using a round tip paintbrush, brush water around the images you want to use, approximately 1-2 milimetres away from the image because the tissue will soak up the water quickly.
- Place your index finger on the image and gently pull the excess tissue away using your craft tweezers. You could also use the handle of a small spoon.

Step 5: Adding your Decoration

- Decide how you want to arrange your tissue images. Then using a mixture of 2/3 PVA, 1/3 water and a drop of washing up liquid, apply a little to the heart surface and side with a sponge brush.
- Place your first image down and add more glue mixture on top gently, brushing away from the middle to push out any air bubbles.
- Carefully smooth out any other bubbles or creases with your finger. Add more glue mixture if necessary so your finger doesn't catch the tissue and tear it.
- Continue to build you decoration and then leave to dry.



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Step 6: Finishing Touches

- Once your decorations are all dry, over the entire heart with some water-based varnish or PVA glue to seal it.
- Add a ribbon bow to the front and a ribbon or cord loop on the back of the heart so you can hang it up.
- Hang your Heart somewhere you will see it daily to remind you to look after your own heart emotionally, mentally and physically.
